

Academic Affairs



Course selections in PowerSchool will open for students this week to make their choices for classes for next year. The 25-26 Course Catalog was sent to students and parents by email this past week, and is available on the website. PowerSchool will remain open through Friday, April 4 for students to submit their course requests.

AVLI Partnership

Some students have expressed interest in our partnership with the Arrupe Virtual Learning Institute (AVLI) to broaden their course opportunities. AVLI is an online Catholic high school course provider that provides a variety of courses for students with highly specific interests. Both semester and year long courses are available for additional course fees of \$285 and \$425 respectively. These courses are largely online, and students should expect to spend about 6-7 hours per week devoted to each. An academic period of time at PJP is provided for them and they will be scheduled in the Panthers' Learning Center during that time to work on these courses. Often times, courses will have a virtual meeting time over zoom that will meet at a specific times to address questions and provide direct contact with the instructor, but for the most part students work independently. Dual Enrollment Opportunity for College Credit

We have partnerships with both Immaculata University and Montgomery County Community College to provide students with the opportunity to earn both college and high school credit. Immaculata University provides two in-person courses, Statistics and Intro to Criminal Justice that are taught by Immaculata Professors at PJP. MONTCO courses are primarily online courses that the students enroll in and we provide an academic period of time for the students where they are scheduled into the Panthers' Learning Center to spend that time devoted to their course work. Some courses are available in the late afternoon and/or evening at MONTCO at both the Pottstown and Blue Bell campus where students can select an inperson opportunity. Additional tuition and fees for these courses are paid directly to Immaculata and MONTCO.

To qualify for AVLI and Dual Enrollment courses, students must be in grades 11 or 12 and have a minimum general average of 88 or better. Some courses have specific prerequisites that must also be met. Students interested in any of these programs are required to express that interest on the Dual Enrollment Interest Form that was shared with them by e-mail last week.

Panthers' Learning Center

Several weeks ago, a representative from Pennsylvania Free Enterprise Week spoke to our sophomores about their summer enrichment program, and since then, 40 PJP sophomores and juniors have applied to participate, the largest number of PJP students in over 5 years.

The previous deadline for application that was shared, February 21, was a priority registration deadline to guarantee students the week they wanted to attend. Guidance Office



Dear Parents/Guardians and Students,

Vaping? Yes, unfortunately many high school students are engaging in this behavior and we are concerned about the effects of nicotine on the developing brain. To support our student body, Pope John Paul II High School in partnership with Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services will be encouraging students to proactively quit by launching a vape buy-back. The program is simple. The student voluntarily hands in their vaping devices, completes an 8-week virtual nicotine cessation program (with signed parent/guardian permission), and will receive an incentive upon completion. Disciplinary and legal consequences will NOT be pursued if the student voluntarily turns in their vape device.

Here is how it works:

- 1. Students can turn in their vape device to the PJP Guidance Office March 17th March 21st at the start of school or after school, from 7:30 a.m. 7:50 a.m. or from 2:30 p.m. 3:00 p.m. (NOTE: the Guidance Office is open on Tuesday, 3/18/25, and Thursday, 2/20/25, when students are not in school. Devices can still be dropped off on these days.)
- 2. Only vapes without THC will qualify for this program.
- 3. Students will be given a paper copy of the parent/guardian cessation program permission form to take home. An email from PJP will also be sent to the parent/guardian with the permission form. A permission form can be returned to the Guidance Office to enroll the student in the cessation program.
- 4. Parent/guardian permission is due by Monday, March 24th.
- 5. Students attend the virtual nicotine cessation program called N.O.T. (Not On Tobacco), which is an evidence-based program created by the American Lung Association. Virtual groups will be an hour a week for eight weeks. During these sessions, students will be encouraged to explore the facts about nicotine, the reasons they started vaping, and provide education on the psychological, physical, and social benefits of quitting.
- 6. N.O.T. is provided for free by Montgomery County's contracted Student Assistance Program (SAP) Provider.
- 7. N.O.T. virtual cessation class dates will be Tuesdays at 6 p.m. on: 3/25, 4/1, 4/8, 4/22, 4/29, 5/6, 5/13 and 5/20.
- 8. Incentive upon completion of the 8-week nicotine cessation program, students will be given the choice of one ticket to prom, \$100 school store credit, or \$100 Amazon gift card (emailed to parent) for their participation.

Considerations:

- This program does not apply to THC vapes. If a student turns in a *THC* vape, the school policy for discipline will be followed.
- Maximum allocation is ONE incentive of the student's choosing.
- Students caught on school property with vape devices without proactively turning them in, will not be eligible to participate.
- Once vape is turned in, it will NOT be returned to the student or parent/guardian even if the N.O.T. program is incomplete.
