Attendance

PJP is an in person educational experience. We respectfully request that you make an effort to limit early dismissals, late arrivals, and missed days for non-medical reasons. Early dismissals and late arrivals are very disruptive to the flow in the classroom. We appreciate your support and cooperation.

Dress Code

It is important to us that our students look their best each and every day. Please take a minute to check that your student is in the correct uniform. Students in violation of the dress code will be notified at the beginning of the school year and will be given time to purchase the correct items to comply. Parents will also be notified.

Cell Phone/Electronic Devices Reminder

In an effort to create an atmosphere conducive to learning, and in accordance with our student handbook, students will NOT be permitted to use their cell phones during the school day, including in the hallways during change of class. Cell phones must be kept in their backpacks or locked lockers during this time. Cell phones are permitted to be used during lunch in the cafeteria and study halls with moderator permission. Earphones and air pods are not permitted to be used or worn during the school day unless specifically allowed by an individual teacher. Cell phones observed or smart watches being used in the classroom setting without permission will be confiscated and demerits will be issued for a cell phone policy violation. A third cell phone policy violation will require a parent to pick up the phone in the Student Services Office at the end of the school day.

We ask that parents refrain from texting or calling students unless in the case of an emergency during the school day.

Located in the main corridor near the chapel and Campus Ministry, the Panthers' Learning Center is the home of academic support and is an active resource for students including:

- A quiet study space from 7:00-7:40am, lunch periods (after students eat), and 2:30-4:00 pm
- National Honor Society tutoring throughout the day
- MCIU math and reading support classes taught by Mrs. Mulligan and Ms. Derstine
- Individual meetings between students and academic support staff
- PAWS program classes and advising
- Extended-time testing
- Chess and Games Club on Fridays

The Panthers' Learning Center staff, along with school leadership and guidance, checks the grades of *all* students weekly as part of Academic Intervention. Students who are failing two classes during a week are asked to spend two lunch periods or after school sessions in the PLC to focus on their studies, study for tests, and submit missing homework.

If there is anything we can do to support your student this year, please feel free to reach out anytime.

Office of School Ministry

The Office of School Ministry is excited for another school year as we accompany our students to have a lived relationship with Jesus. Student Services

Transportation

Transportation schedules for the 2024-2025 school year are established by each individual school district. Some school districts will post the schedules on their website, and others will send written communication by mail two weeks before the school year begins. If you are unaware of your student's bus schedule by August 30th, please contact Stephanie Rowland, Assistant Principal for Student Services, at srowland@pjphs.org.

In June, PJP provided each school district with a list of PJP students who require busing. **If you did not complete a transportation form to arrange transportation for the 2024-2025 school year please [click here](#) for further instructions.** If these forms have been submitted late, transportation at the start of the school year is not guaranteed.

Early Dismissals

There are several early dismissal days on our school calendar. All school districts provide transportation to school on early dismissal days, but not all school districts will provide transportation home.

Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures

To maintain the safety of our school community PJP has established student Drop-Off and Pick-Up procedures. **Please review these procedures [here](#) prior to the start of the school year if you plan on driving students to and from school daily.** We kindly request that parents refrain from parking in our parking spaces for a student drop-off or pick-up because this delays the students, faculty, and staff assigned to the spaces from entering the building 111. In addition, we request that all drivers maintain a 15 mph speed limit as they travel through the lot. Thank you in advance for following these protocols to keep our school community safe.

Parking Passes

For those students who wish to drive to school daily, a new parking permit must be purchased annually. The fee is \$75 and is charged to your FACTS account.

All sophomore, junior, and senior students and parents were emailed a Google form on Monday, August 19th to register. Students interested in parking their car at school should complete the form by no later than Tuesday, August 27, 2024. Permits will be assigned in the order in which they are received. Parking space numbers will be shared with parents by email on Friday, August 30, 2024.

Students who get their driver's license later in the school year and wish to park at school are expected to purchase a parking permit. Students interested purchasing a parking pass later in the year may contact me by email at srowland@pjphs.org or in the Student Services Office. Cars not registered with the Student Services Office are subject to a fine or towing.

School Lunch Account

Lunch is available for all PJP students in the cafeteria. **Students are permitted to pay in cash, however, if you are interested in signing up for a school lunch account please [click here](#) for additional details.** You will need your child's student number to establish an account. Their six digit student number can be found in their FACTS account by clicking on student from the menu on the left.

School Uniform

We are looking forward to our students returning in September looking their best from the first day of school to the last. If there are special circumstances where a student can not be in full uniform, please contact Mrs. Stephanie Rowland, assistant Principal for Student Services (srowland@pjphs.org) for a dress code pass.

Uniform Exchange

Thanks to the generosity of the PJP Community, PJP has a uniform exchange. The Student Services Office will continually accept gently used uniform items and uniform items will be available during the school day throughout the year.

School Supplies

Each individual teacher will specify the supplies their students will need for class. It is best to buy supplies after your student has met with their teachers. If you are looking to take advantage of Back to School sales, students will always need the basics: school bag, pens, pencils, pencil case, notebooks, etc.

School Locks

All students who are new to PJP will receive a school lock on the first day of the school year; this lock is to be used by the students for all four years. All locks placed on school lockers must be a school lock.

All returning PJP students must bring their lock to school upon their return in September.

Any student who does not have their school lock from last year must purchase a new one through the Student Services Office. The cost of a new lock is \$10 and will be charged through FACTS.

All school lock combinations are on file in the Student Services Office for those who do not remember their combination.

All students must have their school lock on their locker by Friday, September 13th. After that date, locks will be placed on student lockers not in use.

ID Cards

All students will be provided with two cards. One will be a student ID card with their photo specifying their class year. Students are expected to wear their student ID on a PJP lanyard as part of their school uniform. Freshman and transfer students will receive a lanyard at the beginning of this year.

The second card is a building access card that must be kept with their student ID. Grades 10 - 12 will have their access card returned to them at the beginning of the year. A \$30 replacement fee will be charged to the FACTS account for any student who did not turn in their access card at the end of the year.

ID's and access cards will be collected at the end of the school year and will be returned the following school year.

Students missing access cards must report it immediately. The fee for a replacement access card is \$30. The fee for the replacement of student ID's is \$5.

Before and After School Hours

Students may begin arriving at school by 7:00 am. Between 7:00 am and 7:40 am all students must report directly to the cafeteria where they are moderated. After 7:40 am all students may report to their locker and homeroom.

Students are permitted to remain after school to visit teachers, participate in scheduled activities, or for transportation. If necessary, students remaining at school after dismissal must report to the Student Commons while waiting for their extra curricular activity to begin or when waiting for a ride home. All students must be picked up by 4 pm unless participating in an extracurricular activity that begins later.

Health Suite

Wanted: PJP Substitute Nurses

Pope John Paul II High School is looking for nurses who would be willing to substitute on an as needed basis. We are looking for caring, compassionate, professionals who love working one-on-one with high school students. A bachelor of nursing is required.

From the School Nurse

The Spring-Ford Area School District's physician has instituted a limit on the number of standing order medications (Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Tums) the school nurses can administer to any given student throughout the school year. While this will not affect most of our PJP students, some students have conditions that require more frequent use of these meds.

How we will handle this: If your student is approaching the ‘max’ allotment of med administration we will simply request that you provide a *private physician order* for the over-the-counter medications. If you know that your PJP student is likely to require frequent doses of Tylenol, Ibuprofen or TUMS, you are encouraged to ask for an order for these at your convenience so that we are all prepared. (*This can all be written in the same order*) You do NOT need to provide these medications - we will still use our med supply, it will just be documented under your private healthcare provider’s order.

How you can help limit medication requests: Please encourage your students to treat any home illnesses and injuries at home prior to coming to school. We also encourage breakfast and hydration in the morning which prevents a multitude of symptoms!!

We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause, but this plan will enable us to care for PJP students as we always have.

Health Forms:

Please note that *all health forms referenced below are located on the PJP website*—Parents tab, select Health and Wellness. These forms are to be completed and signed by BOTH the parent/guardian and physician. Drop off of medications instructions are also listed below:

- If your student requires administration of any medication during the school day, please submit the medication along with the completed *Authorization for School Medication Administration form*. The medication must be in the original over-the-counter or pharmacy labeled bottle.
- If your student has a severe allergy requiring an EpiPen: Please submit the EpiPen(s) along with the completed and signed *Allergy Action Plan*. Please check the expiration date on your EpiPen and bring in its original container.
- Students with asthma: Please complete and submit the *Authorization for School Medication form* with inhaler, if your student needs to carry his/her own inhaler while at school, be sure that the bottom section of this form authorizing self carry is signed by parent/guardian and physician.

Students with seizures: Please bring any required medication along with the completed and signed *Seizure Action Plan* to the nurse.

Instructions for Medication Drop Off to the Nurse

1. Place the appropriate form and medication in a baggie marked with your student’s name and grade. Please verify all medication expiration dates.
2. All medications must be in their original pharmacy issued container and in quantities of no more than 30 doses.
3. Only the nurse and parent can transfer pills due to the need for counting and obtaining signatures. Please do not attempt to drop pill bottles off with any other PJP employee.
4. Email nurse@pjphs.org to schedule drop off arrangements, but we are on-site between 8:30 am and 2:45 pm for med collection during school days.

Attention Parents/Guardians of the Class of 2026 (JUNIORS)

The Pennsylvania Department of Health requires students to submit a physical examination by the beginning of Grade 11.

* If your student did not submit his/her 16 year physical with updated immunizations during sophomore year, please request it from your pediatrician as soon as possible.

* If your student has not yet had a 16 year well exam, please schedule an exam and use the Physical Exam form (located on the PJP website, under the ‘Parents’ tab, select ‘Health and Wellness’) to meet this requirement.

PIAA forms (the actual exam page with MD signature) dated after July 1, 2024, are acceptable, but you must send a copy to the PJP nurses along with updated vaccinations. We cannot access the trainer’s forms, nor can she access ours. We apologize for any inconvenience.

* If you have not already done so, please have this medical information ready to be turned in at the start of the 2024-2025 school year. Forms can also be emailed to nurse@pjphs.org or mailed to the “attention of the school nurse” during the summer.

Thank you for your assistance in obtaining this state-mandated health information.

SENIORS-PJP Transcript Release

Attention Seniors, this is a friendly reminder to submit your *Consent to Release Transcript & Letters of Recommendation Form*, if you have not done so already. This form was given to you last spring.

This signed form authorizes the Guidance Department to send your official transcript and letters of recommendation to all colleges and/or programs to which you have applied. These supporting application documents cannot be forwarded if a signed Consent to Release Form is not on file in the Guidance Office. Please note that standardized test scores (ACT, SAT, etc.) are NOT listed on a student transcript. It is the student's responsibility to send test scores to the colleges and universities to which they apply directly from the testing agency.
