# **Principal's Office**

It has been a great joy having our students back in the building for another exciting year at PJP! We met with all students to review the need to respect one another and look out for each other. We stressed the importance of making sure everyone feels welcome, supported and seen. Please speak with your student about having a positive attitude and reaching out to students who seem to have had trouble finding someone to connect with, especially at lunch. If students are concerned about one another, please encourage them to reach out to guidance, a favorite teacher or to make a report in Safe to Say.

As a reminder, we, with the support of our new Superintendent, will be strictly enforcing the cell phone policy we currently have in place which can be found in our handbook located on our website. Cell phones may be kept in backpacks or locked lockers. Cell phones may not be used in classrooms or hallways. Smart watches must be placed in backpacks when requested by teachers especially during testing. Students may not have AirPods or other listening devices in their ears while walking throughout the building. Cell phones, smart watches, or headphones being used in violation of the policy will be confiscated and demerits and a detention will be issued.

We appreciate your support of this policy as we try to create a welcoming space where students can learn without distractions and spend time talking with each other and supporting one another!

We also spoke to our students about adhering to the dress code and taking pride in their appearance. Dress code demerits will be issued for those in violation of the uniform policy. Skorts found to be shorter than one inch above the knee will need to be replaced.

# Schoology or PowerSchool?

PJP utilizes two student management systems: Schoology and PowerSchool. While they are connected, they serve different functions for our students and faculty. PowerSchool is the gradebook of record, and the place to complete school forms, view attendance, and your student's schedule. Schoology is the Learning Management System, and is best used to view the most up-to-date grades and your student's course information and calendar.

# **Panthers' Learning Center**

Homework is an important part of the educational experience because it gives students an opportunity to practice concepts taught that day, promotes retention of material, and helps students develop time management skills. Many teachers offer students points for completing assignments on time and to the best of their abilities which can really help their grades throughout the year.

To help students be successful in their classes, it is best to:

- Use a planner, labeled Google Doc, or phone reminders to keep track of homework assignments.
- Double check the Schoology to-do list each day with family members.
- Communicate with teachers through email or in-person before class if students have questions or need extra help.
- Visit the Panthers' Learning Center after lunch or before/after school to complete assignments and receive support on assignment completion.
- If assignments are submitted late, students should email their teachers to let them know the assignment has been submitted.

Students are welcome to visit the Panthers' Learning Center throughout the day from 7:00-7:40am, during lunch periods after they are finished eating, and after school until 4:00pm for quiet study. The PLC team is also happy to meet with students anytime to support them in their daily work. # **NexTrex Recycling Challenge**

#### Dear families:

We are excited to announce that PJP II High School will be participating in the NexTrex Recycling Challenge, a fantastic initiative hosted by the Trex Company. Since 2006, Trex has been leading the way in educating the public on the importance of plastic film recycling through school and community programs and we are thrilled to be a part of it this year.

### What is the NexTrex Recycling Challenge?

The NexTrex Recycling Challenge aims to promote the recycling of plastic films, a significant yet often overlooked component of our daily waste. Our challenge period runs until May 7, 2025. During this time, we will work together to collect and recycle a minimum of 1,000 pounds of plastic film. If we reach this goal our school will be rewarded with a beautiful Trex bench made from recycled materials.

### How Can You Help?

We need your support to make this initiative a success. Here's how you can get involved:

- 1. <u>Collect Eligible Plastic Film:</u> Most polyethylene (PE) plastic film and bags, labeled as #2 or #4 are recyclable. Please ensure all plastic is clean, dry and free of food residue. While many types of plastic film are accepted, there are some exceptions. Please see the attached infographic for more details on what IS and IS NOT recyclable
- 2. <u>Drop-off Locations:</u> You can bring your collected plastic film to PJP; collection containers are located in the main foyer, Legacy atrium, and auditorium lobby.
- 3. **Spread the Word:** Encourage your friends, family, and community members to join us in this recycling effort. The more people involved, the greater our impact!
